We are continuing to advertise this where ever we go. More and more whānau are beginning to register and that's fantastic news. This is another great little fundraiser for our marae. The purpose of this kaupapa is to encourage and involve all whānau connected through whakapapa to Moteo Marae, to make a committment to support and help maintain our marae. We, the trustees, like many before us, are charged with the task of managing the maintenance, refurbishment, replacement and financing of the marae buildings, equipment, grounds and urupā. This we do on little more than a shoestring, and the shoestring gets shorter every year. The income we currently receive falls short of our basic everyday running costs and we need to address this problem, the marae needs regular income.

Our aim is to reach out to you the whānau whānui, to commit to bank \$2, \$5, \$10 or \$20 a week or, an amount of your choice, into the above bank account. Our committment is to ensure the whānau have a place to come home to that is able to cater to their needs. We are hoping that whānau who are living locally, nationally or internationally or, have an affinity with Moteo Marae who are unable to attend hui, fundraisers etc, but would like to contribute in some way, can do so by internet banking into the ASB Bank Account. Already we are gaining interest from just talking to whānau, so please spread the Manaaki word. Next time you're at the marae, you will be able to view not only your own whānau name, but those of other whānau who are displayed on our Manaaki 400 board located in the foyer.
