Bledisloe School, a local school situated in Taradale which is just over the hill from Puketapu, visited the marae in March of this year. The visit was part of the school's curriculum for 2015. Three hundred students, fifty parents and teachers experienced the powhiri

(welcome) onto the marae. The entire school spent the day at Moteo Marae.

Greetings took place

with a hariru (handshake and hongi) with the haukāinga (people of the marae) before everyone gathered in Hamuera (the wharekai) for food and drink.

After refreshments, the children joined their various groups to experience flax weaving, mural art, waiata, porotiti, whai and Ki o Rahi activities outside.

Ki o Rahi (a maori game played between 2 teams) was introduced to the tamariki on a circular playing field and included a storytelling element covering the background and legend behind the
