<u>Cruise Ships Lose Interest:</u> The number of Cruise Ships expected in Napier has dramatically reduced due to a major increase in Mooring charges. At least twenty Ships that were expected to arrive during 2015 now will not be coming due to the increase. That's a huge loss to our Tourism and Economy.

<u>Otatara Pa</u> – Roy has completed his Pamphlet to introduce Otatara Pa to Groups. Giving a history of the Pa and surrounding area. This is being offered to local schools.

*Matariki 2015* is fast approaching and we need to prepare for this event. A good time to showcase Arts, Crafts, Kai, Fundraise etc, the opportunities are huge. We had a very successful event in 2014 sponsored by NKII, Napier City Council, Endeavour & Infinity Foundations.

What are the activities to drive? Education / schools / Culture & Food through Tourism and Marketing. 1) Who are you targeting? Reaching the target group with a Google Website (with the Addition of ADWords), can further define what you are offering. You may not think what you do is NOT engaging, but others (Tourists) do. Simple Cooking of Traditional Food is sought after as a Tourist attraction. People are interested in learning about others cultures and traditional foods and tasting and experiencing creating them.

These can be promoted by producing videos to add to the Website which once they are clicked will lead them to an online booking option which will lead to an online payment in advance system = Guaranteed Income. Much comes down to the quality of Content.

<u>Pan Pac Resource Consent</u>: Pan Pac are now producing cardboard so there are added colour and more chemical waste added to the process of effluence discharge. We have been waiting for a breakdown of what the discharge is made up of, Scientists need to monitor this. ERMA are testing once every two years. A letter needs to be written to Regional Council to Monitor on a monthly basis and that we as Mana Whenua, need to be provided the results of the testing.
